



✦ Practical Guide to Visiting the Amalfi Coast

If you plan to take advantage of your trip to our wedding to visit the Amalfi coast, here are some suggestions: ♥

With just 1 day, pick 2 places of the suggested ones. If you stay more than 1 day you can visit all of them.

Positano: color, beach, vistas

Walk down through the lanes to Spiaggia Grande (main beach) and along to Fornillo for a quieter cove (about a 10-minute coastal walk from Marina Grande).

Pop into the Church of Santa Maria Assunta (the green-gold dome by the beach); check the parish page for service/visit times.

Optional boat shuttle to lunch spots like Da Adolfo, or a short coastal cruise.

Nice restaurants (book if you can): Da Adolfo or La Tagliata

Amalfi: cathedral, seaside, history

Climb the grand steps to the Duomo di Sant'Andrea; ticketed complex includes the Cathedral, Cloister, crypt and small museum (hours and inclusions vary by season; budget ~1–1.5 hrs).

Stroll the seafront, old shipyards, and nip round to tiny Atrani (10–15 min walk) for a pretty piazza and beach.

Coffee and lemon desserts at historic Pasticceria Pansa on the Duomo square.

Nice restaurants (book if you can): Sensi

Ravello: gardens & views in the clouds

Villa Cimbrone gardens & the Terrace of Infinity (typically open from 9:00 until early evening; last entry ~30 minutes before). Allow 60–90 mins.

Giardini Principessa di Piemonte: beautiful view

Villa Rufolo gardens by Piazza Duomo (commonly open daily from morning into evening; allow 45–60 mins).

Restaurants are very expensive in Ravello!



Minori: the lemon garden

Stroll between the seafront promenade and citrus-scented lanes; visit the Basilica of Santa Trofimena and the Roman Villa with its Antiquarium.

Stop for a sfogliatella or a lemon dessert at Sal De Riso.

Maiori: the longest beach on the Amalfi Coast

Pause on its wide sandy beach, it's perfect for a dip and for watching the sunset along the seafront promenade.

Vietri sul Mare: the ceramics capital

Wander ceramic-lined lanes and shop for Vietri majolica; look for the tiled dome of San Giovanni Battista in the upper town.

Quick beach look at Marina di Vietri (sandier than many Amalfi beaches).

Getting to Amalfi Coast from Naples it is not that simple. Check by busses or trains or by car.

Quick tips

- **Luggage & stairs:** towns are vertical, pack light.
- **Shoes:** comfy walking shoes (cobblestones + stairs!).
- **Crowds:** start early; book ferries and restaurants in high season.
- Restaurants are **expensive!**
